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A new funding round in Mozambique to support solutions for productive use of energy

The Beyond the Grid Fund for Africa (BGFA) will launch a second funding round in Mozambique focused on productive-use-of-energy solutions will open at the end of June. This is BGFA's sixth Call for Proposals to incentivise clean off-grid energy solutions in Sub-Saharan Africa.

The new funding round will target productive-use-of-energy (PUE) providers across a range of fields, including agriculture (water pumping, irrigation), food processing and distribution (cold chain), fishing and e-mobility. PUE solutions linked to mini-grids will also be eligible. The total funding available will be EUR 3.4 million.

"PUE solutions can provide broad socio-economic benefits for the population of Mozambique, including economic growth, income generation, job creation and often reduced workloads, allowing people time to undertake additional productive activities. Only a few years ago, solar water pumping and solar refrigeration were still classified as 'near-to-market' solutions, but they are now widely represented in the BGFA portfolio in Uganda and Zambia. As a next step, we would like to scale the market in Mozambique," comments **Tina Möller**, Programme Manager at Nefco.

All interested for-profit energy service providers with experience scaling PUE solutions in Mozambique or elsewhere in Sub-Saharan Africa are cordially invited to apply. Applicants will be required to demonstrate capacity to scale their operations. In Mozambique, the Call is being promoted by <u>Associação Moçambicana</u> <u>de Energias Renováveis (AMER)</u>, the Mozambican Renewable Energy Association.

As with recent calls, the new Call (BGFA6) will be administered via a simplified, single-stage application process. Applicants will be asked to submit a Business Plan, in addition to meeting the key eligibility BGFA requirements.

Under the Call for Proposals, opening at the end of June 2024, companies are invited to apply for funding via an online application process. Further information, selection criteria and guidelines will be made available on the BGFA website, <u>beyondthegrid.africa</u>, when the funding round opens.

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About BGFA

The <u>Beyond the Grid Fund for Africa (BGFA)</u> is a multi-donor facility established and managed by <u>Nefco</u> – <u>the Nordic Green Bank</u>. Nefco is an international financial institution based in Helsinki, Finland, focusing on environmental and climate investments and fund management. BGFA is implemented by Nefco, with the support of two project implementation partners. <u>NIRAS</u> is a development and engineering consultancy company headquartered in Denmark. The <u>Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Partnership</u> (<u>REEEP</u>), an international multilateral partnership based in Vienna, Austria, works to accelerate market-based deployment of renewable energy and energy-efficiency solutions in developing countries.

The current EUR 126 million BGFA programme was established in 2019 on Sweden's initiative through the <u>Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida)</u>. It has since been developed by Nefco into a multi-donor programme funded by Denmark through the <u>Ministry of Foreign Affairs</u>, Germany through its development bank <u>KfW</u>, Norway through the <u>Norwegian Agency for Development Cooperation</u> <u>Norad</u> and Sweden. <u>Power Africa</u>, an initiative administered by USAID, is providing an in-kind technical assistance contribution.
